### Environmental Policy

The management and staff of Sandhurst Instruments Limited are committed to the care of the environment, the prevention of pollution and enhancing the environmental quality wherever possible.

Sandhurst will ensure that all activities are carried out in conformance with the relevant legislation, which includes The Environmental Protection Act 1990: Part 1 and other relevant legislation.

Sandhurst seeks to minimise waste arising, promote recycling, reduce energy consumption, promote sustainable use of natural resources, reduce harmful emissions where possible to work with suppliers who themselves have sound environmental policies and will implement our policies through guidelines and training.

Through strategic planning Sandhurst will minimise the environmental effect of new developments and aim to include environmental considerations in investment decisions.

Products will be designed in such a way as to minimise their environmental effects in production, usage and disposal.

An essential feature of Sandhurst's policy is a commitment to improving environmental performance and reducing the environmental impact of waste generation and disposal. In summary, Sandhurst's policy may simply be stated as:

“To be Environmentally Aware, and operate in a manner that is responsible”

### Environmental Impact

- Raw Materials: Consideration will be given to the environmental effects of raw materials sourcing and wherever possible will use materials and components that can be recycled.



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- Waste Disposal: Manufacturing processes have been modified to reduce waste and to ensure that waste is properly recycled.
- Office and Works Material: Sandhurst is reducing the use of hard copy records in favour of electronic format to minimise paper use. Where hard copy is required, it is policy to use recycled paper and paper products, or paper products derived from sustainable forests.
- Communications: Where [possible all communication is conducted by E-mail. The use of postal means and customer/supplier visits is limited to reduce the impact on the environment from transport and subsequent carbon emissions.
- Suppliers: Major sub vendors are being monitored to access their compliance with the principle of good environment policy and the sustainability of their processes, in particular their compliance with RHO and WEEE directives.

### Conclusion

Employee involvement in environmental matters is encouraged at all levels and will be promoted through training, communication and constant appraisal of working methods and techniques.
